Scope and Content Note

The William E. Simon Papers (1964-1971; 1977-1992) document Simon's pre- and post-Treasury years working in the private sector as financial investor and corporate financial consultant, authoring two books, as well as reinvolving himself in government under the Reagan Administration. The Papers (12.6 linear feet - 18 boxes) are organized into five series:

Series I, the correspondence, covers Simon's association with government officials (foreign and domestic), businessmen, and entertainers. Series I correspondence consists primarily of letters to Simon. Most noteworthy are the VIP letters, which include Presidential correspondents Nixon, Ford, Carter, Reagan, and Bush. Foreign government officials are also well represented, including correspondence from Prime Ministers Margaret Thatcher and Takeo Fukuda, and Chancellor Helmut Schmidt. Letters from entertainers include, Bob Hope, Frank Sinatra, Meryl Streep, and Kirk Douglas. Simon's involvement in charities and Catholic issues as chairman of the Lay Commission on Catholic Social Teaching and the U.S. Economy is clearly brought out. Simon's service as President of the Richard Nixon Presidential Archives Foundation is also covered.

The subject files of Series II primarily relate to the 1980 presidential election. The Reagan-Bush positions on the Carter Administration and the economic policy approaches of Reagan and Carter are well documented. Public interest in Simon's potential candidacy for president is discussed, as well as consideration of Simon for a cabinet post in the Reagan Administration.

Series III provides insight into Simon's prolific public speaking engagements and writings. The speeches cover a variety of contexts, including commencement addresses, sporting events, business conferences, campaigns on behalf of various Republican candidates, funeral eulogies, educational symposiums, and various social occasions. Simon's writings are particularly noteworthy and reveal his personal observations regarding numerous issues and topics. Simon addresses the Olympics and various sporting topics, the economy, Congressional performance on various issues, tax reform, disinvestment in South Africa, and Catholic

issues. Draft notes and page proofs of Simon's second book, A Time For Action, are also included.

The audio-visual materials in Series IV chronicle interviews, news conferences, and various speaking engagements. Series V photographs offer visual insight into the many ceremonial and awards dinners attended by Simon, his public speaking engagements, travels, and appearances with various notable persons. The clippings provide information regarding Simon's activities, especially his involvement in the Reagan Administration and his service as President of the United States Olympic Committee during 1981-1984. The memorabilia contains a variety of awards and honorary degrees, medals, and articles pertaining to the XXII and XXIII Olympiads.

Series VI provides insight into Simon's pre-Treasury years with Salomon Brothers investment banking firm. Simon's views on municipal bond trading and the opportunities of the secondary municipal market, along with his involvement with investment banking conferences, is revealed in detail.
